All Ages Worship Service and a Guest Preacher joining Racquel

This Sunday is an **All Ages Worship Service** and we will celebrate **Martin Luther King, Jr. Sunday.** We will also welcome guest preacher, **Rev. Dr. Cynthia L. Smothers** who will join Pastor Racquel leading worship. <u>Rev. Dr. Cynthia Smother's bio</u>

Pastor Racquel and Rev. Dr. Cynthia have a history of sharing the pulpit on Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Sunday and became friends while Racquel served as Chaplain to the John Clarke Senior Living community in Middletown, RI through the 2020-2021 pandemic shut-down. They've also shared other ministries together as you can read in the bio link above.



We hope that you can join us for worship this Sunday, either in-person in the sanctuary, or online (the links are in the calendar above and below)

Multi-platform Worship - Sundays 10 am

All are invited to join us for our **multi-platform worship service** at **10 a.m.** every Sunday. For those attending in person, we **require masks** be worn in worship (with exemptions for those under 2 or for medical reasons). We continue to



take precautions to provide the safest conditions possible for everyone.

For those not yet ready, self-isolating, or unable to join us in person, the services are livestreamed so they can be watched online - either live or later - at **www.facebook.com/bccucc** or **https://bccucc.org/live-stream-2/**. We invite you to join us for worship - in person or online.

Our response to the increase in COVID cases

COVID safety protocols have been updated and extended

The increasing number of COVID cases has resulted in some necessary updates to the measures we are taking to keep everyone as safe and healthy as possible while at church. An email was sent to the congregation on Jan 5th outlining the updates (<u>read it here</u>). At their Jan 11th meeting, Church Council extended the updated protocols through the end of January - at which time they will be reassessed.

- In summary, the following protocols are currently in place:
 - Continuing masking*, social distancing, and signing in for worship

- No singing of any kind in the sanctuary by choir or congregation
- Masks will be worn by the worship leaders throughout the service
- Sitting in every other pew. The ushers will oversee this.
- No Church School
- No Youth Group

In addition please note the following changes:

- The children should remain in the pews with their families for Children's Time and not come up front
- No choir rehearsals

*If possible, we encourage the wearing of KN95 masks which have been proven to be more effective at stopping the omicron virus. Surgical masks may be worn but because they don't fit as well to the face, they're not quite as effective. Unfortunately, cloth masks are not good at filtering out the omicron virus so should be avoided.

Church office hours may change

Due to the current COVID situation, some of the church staff will be working remotely whenever possible. As a result the church office may not always be open as scheduled. If you plan to stop by, please call first. Messages can be left on the answering machine and calls will be returned as we have remote access to our phone messages as well as to our emails.

The church office is scheduled to be closed on Mon, Jan 20th for MLK Jr. Day.

Calendar changes may happen

The church's Annual Budget Meeting has been moved online and will be held via zoom rather than in the sanctuary after worship (see later for details)

Some of the meetings and groups currently scheduled on the calendar may need to be moved on line, postponed or cancelled. Watch your email inbox or contact the team or group leader for any updates that might affect you.

Return of the virtual choir!

Even though there will be no in-person singing in worship for the next few weeks, there will still be music! We'll have the opportunity to watch and hear again some of the hymns and anthems recorded by the BCCUCC virtual choir, as well as some other music videos. We thank our Worship Tech Team for their work in making all of this possible.

Annual Budget Meeting to be held online

Our church's Annual Budget Meeting will be held virtually via **Zoom** at **11:30 a.m.** on **Sunday, January 23rd**.

Due to the recent spike in the number of covid cases, we've seen a significant drop in the number of people attending inperson worship, so it's very unlikely that we'd have enough members present for a quorum. By moving the meeting online it allows those who can't attend in person to still

participate in the meeting. Unfortunately, it isn't possible to hold a hybrid meeting where some members can attend in-person and others virtually – the technology in the sanctuary just doesn't allow it.

So we invite you to **attend virtually** and hope many members will, so that we have the necessary quorum to hold the meeting. We've moved the time of the budget meeting to



11:30 am in the hope that those who do attend worship in-person will have time to get home and login before the meeting starts. You can join the zoom meeting via computer or call in via a regular phone. *The zoom information isn't included here for security reasons but was in the email sent to the congregation.*

The budget will be emailed to the congregation prior to the meeting.
