


'Peaceful Pause and Prayer' continues during these tumultuous times

The Church Council met on Tuesday, January 12th and as promised in an earlier communication, discussed the future of moving back to in-person services.


After much discussion, the Church Council felt moving to in-person services is not possible at this time and we will continue with online worship services.

Church Council will reassess this again when three goals are met. One is that we have a higher rate of vaccinated people. Secondly, we need to see the positivity rate of infection go down, and thirdly, the state increases the capacity of places of worship. When these three goals are met, Church Council will once again discuss the return to in-person.

Sermon series continues


Dale and Linda started a new sermon series on Jan 10th entitled *Short Stories of Jesus*. They are exploring four of Jesus' parables found throughout the gospels. Many of these stories you will have heard before. What makes this series interesting is that the sermons are based on the work of Amy-Jill Levine, a professor of Jewish studies at Vanderbilt Divinity School. She tries to approach the New Testament as one of Jesus' original listeners might have. Come (virtually) and hear these timeless stories in a new way! Remaining dates are Jan 17th, 31st, and Feb 7th. Guest Preacher - Rev Jim Antal

On **Sunday, January 24th** the Rev. Jim Antal will be our guest preacher. Jim is the former Conference Minister of the Massachusetts Conference of the UCC and is a well-known advocate for climate justice and its intersection with faith. He is the author of the recently released book *Climate Church, Climate World.*

About his new book, Archbishop Desmond Tutu writes, "Jim Antal shows how the church can engage the urgent moral crisis of climate change. This book will inspire both



the courage and conviction people of faith need to provide the leadership necessary to realise [sic] God's dream of a just world in which humanity is reconciled to all of creation."

There will be a follow up virtual Q&A with Jim at a later date, and also a possible adult discussion class/study. Learn more

Knitting for Others Group



The National Resources Defense Council




has described the financial package as "perhaps the most significant climate legislation Congress has ever passed." Read the article and interview
