Clergy away

As announced last month, Brendan has been called to serve a church in Forest Grove, Oregon. His last day at BCCUCC will be **Sunday**, **January 26th**, Please mark your calendars and plan to join us for a special coffee hour after worship that day as we say farewell to Brendan and thank him for his five and a half years of ministry with us. The Fellowship Hall Arch Project is about to begin!

The Buildings & Grounds Team and the Finance Team extend a hearty **THANK YOU** to all who submitted a financial pledge towards the Fellowship Hall Arch Project. The cost of the project will total around \$30,000 and work begins next week. Our very generous lead givers pledged \$25,000 and 35 church families pledged an additional \$5,600 for a total of

\$30,600. To date, we have received \$28,000 of the pledged funds. Additional pledges are still coming in and are most welcome, as there may be some overages as the work progresses. And there are other capital needs on the horizon. We are blessed to have such generous folks in this congregation!

Repair work on the arches in Fellowship Hall is scheduled to begin on **Monday**, **January 6th** and last between two and four weeks. During this time Fellowship Hall will not be usable, so coffee hour after worship will take place in the vestry, located below the sanctuary. It is hoped that the library will be accessible from the rest of the building by walking through the hall on the road side beyond the interior posts. However, we ask that on Sunday mornings you avoid the construction area by walking around the outside of the education building to get to the church, rather than enter via the kitchen door and try to walk through the building. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

Mass Incarceration Awareness Sunday is January 12th

Although the general population is largely unaware of it, the US prison population has skyrocketed over recent decades. Prison populations have increased 700% in the past half century. That, along with the privatization of prisons have turned incarceration into big business. Additionally, incarceration rates for black males is more than three times the percentage of black males in society. What does all this mean for America today? What does our faith as Christians call us to do when we come across such staggering statistics?



Rev. Marilyn Kendrix, former Transitional Conference Minister for the RI Conference, UCC, will be joining us for worship on **Sunday, January 12th** and sharing her work raising Christian awareness of this growing issue in our country. Please come join her and the rest of us.

No Swaps in January!




Women's Faith Group


