Sermon series continues

Dale and Linda are exploring some of Jesus' parables found throughout the gospels in a series entitled *Short Stories of Jesus*. Many of these stories you will have heard before. What makes this series interesting is that the sermons are based on the work of Amy-Jill Levine, a professor of Jewish studies at Vanderbilt Divinity School.
