

Volunteer for the 'Barrington Day of Caring'


Monday, October 11th 2021 - Indigenous Peoples' Day

- 11:00 am 12:00 noon: Meet at Barrington Town Hall, Volunteer check-in, Volunteer Kick off at 12:00 noon
- 12:00 noon 4:00 pm: Break into teams, Board transport to project locations, Work will last four (4) hours.

It's not too late to volunteer for the 2021 'Barrington Day of

Caring'. This annual event brings Barrington neighbors together to create a positive impact on our community and this year's event will be helping local residents with a variety of outdoor projects. Examples of Day of Caring projects include repairing a fence, gate, shed, railings, steps, porches, cutting back overgrown bushes or hedges, yard clean-ups.

Volunteers will be assigned to projects, pre-planned and organized, to assist residents with home projects they need extra help with. Due to pandemic precautions, projects will be limited to outdoor projects and have smaller groups of volunteers.

Food for TAPIN to be collected at 'Barrington Day of Caring'

Touch A Person In Need (TAPIN) provides resources to address food insecurity and economic hardship for East Bay residents. It is one of the many local organizations working with one another for Barrington's Day of Caring. All are invited to drop off non-perishable food items at the volunteer check-in at the Town Hall (see above). Donations will be delivered to TAPIN. Thank you.



Multi-platform Worship - Sundays 10 am

All are invited to join us for our multi-platform worship service at 10 a.m. every Sunday.

For those attending in person, we **require masks** be worn in worship (with exemptions for those under 2 or for medical reasons). We continue to take precautions



to provide the safest conditions possible for everyone, and have <u>new updated</u> <u>guidelines</u> in place. If you plan to worship with us in person in the sanctuary we ask that you read them ahead of time.

Pumpkin Palooza for church school families!








A Community First Conversation about Indigenous Peoples' Day

What is CAIM?

Last Sunday as we took the Neighbors in Need offering, Dale mentioned that 1/3 of the gifts received would go to support the Council for



American Indian Ministry. Here is more info from the UCC website on what CAIM is:

The <u>Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM)</u> is the voice for American Indian people in the UCC. CAIM provides Christian ministry and witness to American Indians and to the wider church. Justice issues that affect American Indian life are communicated to the whole UCC by CAIM.

Historically, the forebears of the UCC established churches and worked with Lakota, Dakota, Nakota, Mandan, Hidatsa, Arickara, and Hocak in North and South Dakota, Wisconsin and northern Nebraska. Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. CAIM supports these local churches and their pastors. In addition, CAIM strives to be a resource for more than 1,000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations and to strengthen their participation in the life of the church.

Reminders

Masks are required in both the education and church buildings

Masks are required for all participants in worship - with the following exclusions:

- anyone with a medical reason why they can't wear a mask
- children under the age of 2
- while leading worship



Education building is open with some important requirements

The education building re-opened on Sept 1st for church and public use with the following **requirements**:

- All visitors attending meetings or events shall wear appropriate masks at all times (Note: Visitors includes both church people and outside groups)
- Hand sanitizer shall be made readily available for all attendees (this is the responsibility of the organization/individual holding the event)
- An accurate copy of attendees and contact information shall be kept (this is

- the responsibility of the organization/individual holding the event)
- Weather permitting, doors and windows are to be propped open
- Any room or venue utilized by a group shall remain vacant for at least 20 hours before being utilized by a separate group.
