

'Neighbors in Need' offering is this Sunday, October 11th

Neighbors in Need (NIN) is a special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of



justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to UCC churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice. This year, special consideration will be given to projects focusing on serving our immigrant neighbors and communities. BCCUCC will observe the NIN offering on **Sunday, October 11th**, 2020. Although we won't be able to collect donations during worship that Sunday, the Mission and Justice Team invites you to mail your gift to the Church Office *by Sun, Oct 25th.* Checks should be made payable to "BCCUCC" with "NIN' in the memo line and mailed to Barrington Congregational Church UCC, 461 County Road, Barrington RI 02806. If you do have an account, search for the church's Facebook Page which is 'Barrington Congregational Church UCC'.
