Spice Kits for Crossroads

Throughout Advent, we will be collecting spice kits for our neighbors at Crossroads. Similar to the Welcome Home baskets but much smaller, the Spice Kits are basically starter spices for folks entering their own homes with the support of Crossroads. Suggested items are salt, pepper, garlic powder, onion powder, vanilla, oregano, sage, parsley, etc.

Sunday, December 24 Services


Youth Group

Providence Singers concert of Rachmaninoff Vespers - Nov 18 & 19

The Providence Singers will be performing two concerts o f Rachmaninoff's All-Night Vigil (aka "Vespers").

The piece has been praised Rachmaninoff's finest as achievement. Written in the



twilight of the Romantic era of classical music, this work was greatly influenced by Tchaikovsky's music, particularly his setting of the all-night vigil. Rachmaninoff based ten of the fifteen sections on Orthodox chant, sung a cappella in the ancient language Church Slavonic. He wrote for the full range of the human voice, including the rarest voice type of all: the low, sonorous tones of the basso profundo. The music is almost symphonic, with as many as eleven vocal lines creating rich textures. There will be two performances:
