Stewardship Update & request for Giving Cards to be returned

On a picture-perfect day, approximately 90 folks attended the Consecration Sunday Lunch on Nov. 7th to celebrate the culmination of the 2022 Stewardship Campaign.

To date, the church has received 67 Giving Cards from members and friends making a financial commitment for 2022. Almost half of these cards are increased commitments over 2021. The total commitment amount for 2022 so far is \$297,014 – many thanks to those that have



already made a commitment. We hope to receive many more Giving Cards so we can continue to build on the mission and work of our church. Giving Cards were mailed last week to those who were unable to join us on Consecration Sunday.

If you intend to return a Giving Card for 2022, we hope to hear from you as soon as possible. Our Finance Team and Church Council are working hard on the 2022 budget and many of their decisions are based on these financial commitments. Update to our COVID Safety Guidelines/Requirements

As we continue to move forward in the pandemic, and also prepare for the Advent season, Church Council discussed and agreed to the following changes to our protocols at Church.

- 1. In order to accommodate increased attendance, we will first have ushers seat people in every other pew. Once those seats are filled, ushers will seat in open pews.
- 2. With the season changing and keeping windows open less feasible, we will be purchasing and installing HEPA filters in the corners of the sanctuary.
- 3. We will continue to require masks be worn by everyone with the exception of those under age 2, those with a medical reason not to, and those leading worship.

4. Singing will still be allowed but done quietly

These changes will be in place starting Sunday, December 5th.

Additional ushers needed

You may have noticed that many of the same people are serving as ushers each week as we currently have a shortage of volunteers. We invite you to join them and become an usher. It's a great way to serve the church and be a friendly face to all who come to worship in our sanctuary – especially newcomers! the schedule. Ushers are asked to arrive a little early to prepare the sanctuary for worship, hand out bulletins and seat people, collect the offering, and clear up after the service. All are welcome to serve as an usher and training will be provided.

COVID Safety Reminders

Masks are required in both the education and church buildings

Masks are required for all participants in worship - with the following exclusions:

- anyone with a medical reason why they can't wear a mask
- children under the age of 2
- while leading worship

Education building is open with some important requirements

The education building re-opened on Sept 1st for church and public use with the following requirements:

 All visitors attending meetings or events shall wear appropriate masks at all times (Note: Visitors includes both church people and outside groups)





- Hand sanitizer shall be made readily available for all attendees (this is the responsibility of the organization/individual holding the event)
- An accurate **copy of attendees and contact information** shall be kept (this is the responsibility of the organization/individual holding the event)
- Weather permitting, doors and windows are to be propped open
- Any room or venue utilized by a group shall **remain vacant for at least 20 hours** before being utilized by a separate group.
