The BCCUCC Open and Affirming Team has invited Quinten Foster, Director of Transgender Whole Healthcare at East Bay Community Action Program (EBCAP), to come and



speak with our congregation after worship on **Sunday, November 5**. This workshop will focus on understanding transgender identity in order to deepen our knowledge and understanding of this minority community and their personal experiences. encourage those present to ask relevant questions, inviting us to lean into some of the confusion or lack of clarity many of us may have on the issue. **Our goal for the workshop is to provide a safe and healthy place where honest and compassionate dialogue can take place.** All are invited to attend.

Providence Singers concert of Rachmaninoff Vespers - Nov 18 & 19

The Providence Singers will be performing two concerts of Rachmaninoff's All-Night Vigil (aka "Vespers").

The piece has been praised as Rachmaninoff's finest achievement. Written in the



twilight of the Romantic era of classical music, this work was greatly influenced by Tchaikovsky's music, particularly his setting of the all-night vigil. Rachmaninoff based ten of the fifteen sections on Orthodox chant, sung a cappella in the ancient language Church Slavonic. He wrote for the full range of the human voice, including the rarest voice type of all: the low, sonorous tones of the basso profundo. The music is almost symphonic, with as many as eleven vocal lines creating rich textures. There will be two performances:


Online donations to the church through our website
