A summary of Church Chats with Pastor Dale

Some common themes arose

8 weeks ago Dale shared an idea about connection: making sure that he was serving and supporting the needs of our church family during these unprecedented times. We launched Church Chats with Pastor Dale, where we could get together in small groups to listen, support and celebrate one another. We held 4 Church Chats with a total of 25 people across 4 meetings and we asked 5 questions. And we have to say – these sessions not only strengthened our faith in our church community but brought an opportunity for connection and closeness to each other.



Each session was unique but there were definitely some common themes of what we're all feeling right now.

- 1. Things are tough. Whether it's working from home, balancing the needs of our personal sanity with our children, deep loneliness, resurfaced anxieties, old illnesses, new loss, frustration things are definitely hard. And we're all feeling the weight of these worries. Being able to support each other in these small group chats allowed for everyone to sympathize and empathize. And that helped many feel less alone in their struggles.
- 2. **Everyone wants connection**. Even though there was some chatter about Zoom fatigue, a lot of folks agreed that it's better than nothing! In fact, that connection came from some unlikely sources, with many folks sharing that this pandemic has brought them closer to people they wouldn't have normally spoken to.
- 3. We all need a safe space. These are tough times and our mental health is taking a hit. Having safe and comfortable place to share is imperative -and we're

- so pleased to hear that the chats provided that for folks. These sessions were only an hour or so but relationships are strengthened by moments of trust and sharing and we were happy to witness such sincere bonding.
- 4. **New connections are an unexpected joy.** The attendees were comprised by fate, we didn't actively move folks from group to group like planning a perfect dinner party. And so, each group was unique. But when people had a chance to talk and listen with members they never otherwise would have hung out with that was a delightful surprise for so many. And we're so hopeful that connection will carry over when we see each other in person!
- 5. **We've redefined fun**. Whether it was binge watching shows on Netflix, Reading (both fluffy and serious!) enjoying nature, playing games, or finding out that we actually *do* in fact like our immediate family. Some of us got new pets, some of us got to baking, some learned new languages but we all have found ways to have fun even during these tough times.

So, **thank you** to all who joined. And now we ask the question: what's next? We think there's a great benefit for having more Church Chats. We'll have new questions to inspire us and hopefully more people to sign up!
