We celebrate Communion during worship on January 3rd



Interfaith Coalition to Reduce Poverty

The new legislative session at the Rhode Island State House is different this year amidst pandemic protocols, but one tradition remains the same: the coalition's 13th Annual 'Fighting Poverty with Faith' Vigil will take place on January 5th at 3pm on Zoom.

This year the vigil will be held virtually. The event's agenda will include keynote speakers, elected officials taking the virtual podium, music and prayer, and the attendance and encouragement of you, faith and poverty advocates, alike. Let's start the year together and declare that in 2021 we will
