Lenten Opportunities


Ash Wednesday Service

Ash Wednesday, March 6th, marks the beginning of the observance of Lent. There will be an Ash Wednesday service at 7 pm in the sanctuary to which all are welcome. The service will have our choir, some hymns, time for prayer, a few brief reflections, and an opportunity to receive ashes for those who wish it. This service should last about 30 minutes.



Soul Talk: Leaning to Listen to the Divine Soul Within

One of our growth offerings this Lent is an adult series exploring *Soul Talk*, a new book by Dr. Kirk Byron Jones. Dr. Jones has written numerous faith-based books on rest, joy, and play. 
Wondrous Encounters
