This year the UCC celebrates the 75th anniversary

This Lenten offering supports the disaster, refugee/immigration, and development ministries of the UCC within Wider Church Ministries throughout the world. When a disaster strikes or people are displaced or made refugees by violence or extreme poverty, you are part of the immediate response and of the long-term recovery. Through OGHS you engage in holistic development programs including health care, education, agriculture, food sustainability, micro-financing and women's empowerment. Because the UCC relates in mutual partnership to churches and organizations through Global Ministries and worldwide response & recovery networks, your contributions to OGHS put you in the right place at the right time for the relief and recovery of the most vulnerable. You meet immediate needs and you address the underlying causes that create those needs in the first place.

United Against Hate Workshop

Federal and local officials throughout the US are working with community members to discuss effective strategies to prevent and respond to hate crimes and incidents.

A **United Against Hate Workshop**, has been organized by the US Attorney's Office, District of RI, in collaboration with Temple Habonim, and will take place on **Tuesday, March 26** at **Temple Habonim**, 165 New Meadow Road, Barrington. The workshop goals are:

- 1. Learn how to distinguish between a hate crime, hate incident, discrimination, and free speech.
- 2. Learn about real-life examples of hate crimes and incidents.
- 3. Identify the importance and methods of reporting expressions of hate.
- 4. Share and learn about personal experiences with a diverse, five-member panel.
- 5. Share your thoughts, concerns, and ideas on how we can mitigate hate in our communities.

The evening's schedule is:

- **5 5:30 pm** Registration and (optional) light dinner.
- 5:30 7:30 pm Presentation and Panel Discussions.
- 7:30 8 pm Coffee, desert & networking.





Providence Singers Concert "Considering Matthew Shepard" Saturday, March 9 7 pm WaterFire Arts Center, Providence

Considering Matthew Shepard is a three-part fusion oratorio composed by Craig Hella Johnson and set to poetic text by a wide range of voices: Lesléa Newman, Michael Dennis



Brown, Rumi, and 12th-century mystic Hildegard of Bingen. Also included are passages from Matthew's personal journal, interviews, newspaper reports, and writings from his parents, Judy and Dennis Shepard.

The work will be presented by the **Providence Singers**, a 100-voice concert choir that performs with the Rhode Island Philharmonic. Directed by Christine Noel, they will be joined by guest

singers, soloists, a diverse instrumental ensemble, and video.

The **Rhode Island Gay Men's Chorus** will also perform, opening the concert with selections that include a world premiere of a work by their artistic director, composer Kim Kuda.

The vision for this concert reflects that of the <u>Matthew Shepard Foundation</u>: ...to amplify the story of Matthew Shepard to inspire individuals, organizations, and communities to embrace the dignity and equality of all people. Through local, regional, and national outreach, we empower individuals to find their voice to create change and challenge communities to identify and address hate that lives without our schools, neighborhoods and homes."

To this end, the Providence Singers have invited several local LGBTQ+ organizations to participate in a networking event before the concert. **Doors open at 6:30**; please plan to arrive early to chat with our guests and learn more about their important work in our community.
