Loaves & Fishes BACKPACK program - food donations needed

Our church is providing food bags to 25 students in need at the DelSesto Middle School in Providence one Friday a month for the remainder of the school year (March, April, May, and June). The first delivery will take place tomorrow, March 25th. Thank you to all the volunteers who came out on Tuesday to help with the preparation.



We are partnering with 'We Share Hope' (<https://wesharehope.org>) to receive some donated groceries, and 'Books are Wings' (<https://www.booksarewings.org>) who are donating 2 books per student. To supplement these donations and continue to fill the bags, we hope to add regular items each month such as peanut butter, bread, oatmeal, canned tuna, canned chicken, pasta, pasta sauce, fruit cups, shelf stable pudding etc - and are asking the congregation to help by donating these food items.

Food donations need to be dropped off at the church no later than Sunday, April 10th so that the bags can be packed before our next delivery to the DelSesto School on April 15th. A collection box will be placed in the narthex as you go up the stairs to the sanctuary.

If you wish to help pack the bags, we will next meet in Fellowship Hall on **Tuesday April 12th** at 4pm. Anyone is welcome to join us.

From our Mission and Justice Team

Holy Joe's Cafe

The Mission and Justice Team wants to make the congregation aware of an important giving opportunity for military chaplains, who support active-duty military personnel. **Holy Joe's Café** is a UCC-supported organization, which provides coffee



to military chaplains to help them make connections with active-duty military personnel. The simple act of providing coffee to them gives chaplains a way to reach out to troops and initiate conversations, that might not otherwise have occurred.

Holy Joe's Café originated at a UCC church in Wallingford, CT in 2006. Since 2006 Holy Joe's Café has grown to serve billions of cups of coffee and helped open over 300 coffee houses, mainly in the Middle East but also in places like Africa, Europe, and NATO military hospitals (*source – Holy Joe's Café website*).

Since Russia invaded Ukraine, Holy Joe's Café is seeing an urgent increase in the demand for coffee and support for U.S. military chaplains, due to the rapid deployment of troops to Europe.

Prior to the pandemic, donations for Holy Joe's Café were collected during Coffee Hour. Reminders

FREE At-Home Rapid COVID Tests still available - no limits

The church still has supplies of COVID test kits. The kits are available for pick up on the way out of church each Sunday or you can contact the church office (401) 246-0111 or office@bccucc.org to arrange a pick up during the week. Each box contains two tests. There is no limit on how many can be taken by a person or household. If you know of others who need them, please take and pass along.



Important note: Many COVID test kits have had their **expiration date extended by 3 months** as more research has been done on the chemicals used. The AccessBio test kits we received show an expiration date of APR 2022. Checking the lot number on their website shows that the expiration date has been extended to JULY 2022. Information couldn't be found for the iHealth test kits which are labelled to expire 2022-06-28.


