

Palms available for pick-up

We have palms available for pick up for everyone who wants one (or a few!). We will then be incorporating these palms into our Palm Sunday All-Ages Worship service (*see below*). **From 10 am on Friday, March 26th through Sunday morning, March 28th** we will have a tub located outside the Education Building in front of the rainbow doors, for anyone to come by and pick up their palms. We will have both **ecopalms** and traditional **straight palms** available.

Peaceful Pause and Prayer during Holy Week

Our semi-weekly morning meditation series will shift to EVERY DAY during Holy Week. At **8 am** on **Monday, March 29th through Good Friday, April 2nd**, Rev. Dale Azevedo will host a half hour meditation online focused on the themes of Holy Week. Maundy Thursday Service of Tenebrae and Communion

Easter Sunrise Service

We are offering a brief **in-person outdoor** sunrise service on Easter morning, **Sunday, April 4th**. The service is going to be held at **6:15 am** at the church on the back terrace (behind Fellowship Hall) overlooking the Barrington River. We are not advertising this service in town or partnering with other faith communities to make it happen. We will be keeping this service small to stay within RI COVID-19 guidelines.



All attendees must:

- **Pre-register** We need to know how many and who is coming so we can be prepared and have proper contract tracing should we need it. Register via <u>SignUpGenius</u>, or by contacting the church office (email <u>office@bccucc.org</u> or call (401) 246-0111 and leave a message).
- Stay physically distanced All families must remain 6 feet away from all others at all times.
- Wear masks Even if you have been vaccinated, EVERYONE must wear a mask.
- Not sing Sadly, there will be no singing. However, humming is allowed :).
- Not socialize Of course you can say "hello" and such, but no shaking of hands, hugging, or even lingering around too long after the service will be a problem. We are still in a pandemic with people getting sick and dying every day.

This service is acting as a test on how we might handle in-person services in the future. Attendees will need to follow these guidelines. If we cannot, it hinders our ability to offer in-person worship in the future as the pandemic continues.

Easter Morning Online Worship Service

Have no fear if you are not comfortable attending our in-person sunrise service or just don't want to get up that early. Linda and Dale will be hosting our regular online **10 am** worship service on Easter morning too. We have some fun things planned for this service including videos of some of our children's activities and even some sharing from some of our seniors. Deadline extended for Easter donations to our Chancel Fund

We ask that all donations and dedications be received in the church office by the extended deadline of Monday, March 29th. Thank you for your donation.











together on climate justice. The UCC and the People's Justice Council are among ecoAmerica's 10 finalists in the 2021 American Climate Leadership Awards contest. They join nine other finalists from many sectors of society — and are the only joint finalist. Learn more

There's a red 'DONATE' button on the right side of the black menu bar near the top of each page. Clicking on it




will take you to the 'Giving to BCCUCC' page. In the middle is a link to **Tithe.ly** through which you can make a donation to the church either using a credit card or directly from
