Black Lives Matter Community Gathering

The Black Lives Matter community gathering for May is on Sunday, May 23rd from 1 - 2:15 pm, and will be held on the lawn of Barrington Town Hall. To mark the one-year anniversary of George Floyd's murder by a Minnesota police officer, and twelve months since the interfaith community began holding silent monthly vigils in support of Black lives, this month's event will feature speakers including local clergy, community leaders, and representatives from Black Lives Matter Rhode Island. We will remember, mourn, and say the names of people killed



because of racism and hatred. We will also be collecting specific food items for Higher Ground International (see below).

The gatherings are sponsored by Barrington Congregational Church, UCC; Barrington Interfaith Partners; Barrington Presbyterian Church; St. James Lutheran Church; Sts. Matthew and Mark Episcopal Church; St. John's Episcopal Church; Temple Habonim; & United Methodist Church of Barrington.

Food collection for Higher Ground International

Higher Ground International is a Providence-based social service agency that supports African immigrants and others struggling in poverty. A food collection will take place this weekend in Barrington and specific items have been requested - please bring only: rice, oatmeal, cream of wheat, cooking oil, and root vegetables. Items will be collected at the Black Lives Matter gathering on Sunday, May 23rd (see above). They can also be dropped off on Saturday, May 22nd from 9 - 11 am in front of our church's education building.



Major changes in worship at BCCUCC!

Online Sunday worship ONLY on May 23rd, June 6th, 13th & 20th

In Person, Outdoor Worship ONLY on May 30th!

We are excited to announce our first full in-person worship service for **Sunday**, **May 30th**. This service will take place at **10 am** along the river walk (behind the Education Building) and will be in lieu of our virtual service. **We will only have one service on that day**.



Please be advised of the following requirements for all attendees based on the latest CDC guidelines:

- All attendees are required to visit the welcome table upon arrival in order to sign in. Hand sanitizer will also be available.
- Non-vaccinated attendees are required to wear masks at all times.
- Vaccinated attendees are required to wear masks when you arrive, leave, and any time that you are not seated socially distanced from others.

- To maintain social distance, please ensure that you (and your family pod) are 3
 feet from other family pods. If you bring chairs, please set these up with this 3foot distance in mind.
- We will not be singing. Humming is suggested.

Please be sure to bring your own chair and anything else you feel you will need. The buildings will not be accessible on this morning.

Finally, this plan is weather permitting. If the weather is borderline or nice, we will be outside, in-person. If it is raining hard, we will move to online worship. 

Appreciating the Gift of God's Creation - an invitation to use the church grounds

Our church sits on a uniquely beautiful piece of property. Now that the weather is getting warmer we welcome you to come enjoy the sunshine, the carpets of green grass, and the views of the water. Bring your own chairs and gather with friends, have a picnic and watch the changing tide, experience walking the labyrinth as meditative а path prayer. Information about walking the labyrinth is again available in the box next to the walkway.



We are a congregation that cares for others. For the safety of everyone we ask that all follow the RI Dept. of Health updated outdoor mask guidance:

- If you meet the criteria of being fully vaccinated you are no longer required to wear a mask outdoors when you are at least three feet apart from others. "Fully vaccinated means you've gotten all recommended doses of a COVID-19 vaccine authorized by the United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA) or World Health Organization (WHO) and more than 14 days have passed since the final dose."
- If you are partially vaccinated or not vaccinated, you're more likely to get and spread COVID-19 so wearing a well fitted mask and distancing 6 feet apart from those you don't live with is still recommended.

The goal is to provide a safe environment for all visitors and to keep the outdoor environment tidy.

- Safety levels assume the recommended prevention measures are followed.
- A tidy environment assumes that what you bring in you also take out. Please do not leave any trash behind, including pet waste.

Climate action needed!

The Act On Climate bill has passed, but Climate Action Rhode Island (CARI)'s other endorsed bills at the State House need your help to move forward!

Two bills of note this week — can you take either or both of these quick actions?

1. The Climate Literacy Act (S464/H5625)

would give students and teachers the resources they need for our kids to be educated about climate change. Please take part in the RI Environmental Education Association's postcard campaign — just sign up on the website and postcards will be delivered to your door!

2. The **TEAM Act (Transportation Emission And Mobile Community Act**, S872/H6310) would enter Rhode Island into the regional Transportation Climate Initiative. Hank Webster spoke to CARI about its benefits last month (catch the video recap and slide deck if you missed it), and DEM has produced a factsheet.

Stay tuned for an upcoming action on behalf of the **100% Renewable Electricity Standard** (S629/H5762), which will be CARI's top legislative priority for the remainder of the session!

Community Choice Aggregation

Barrington's Resiliency and Energy Committee recently reported that Barrington's Community Aggregation plan is currently under review by the Public Utilities Commission (PUC).

What is Community Choice Aggregation? Watch the video of CARI's May 2021 Community Meeting that featured a panel presentation on how Rhode Island towns and



cities can get cheaper, more renewable electricity power for all their residents. It's surprisingly easy!
