A 2nd Special Congregational Meeting - this Sunday, May 12 after worship

Why are we having another Special Congregational Meeting?

At the Congregational Meeting held after worship on Sunday, April 28, the church membership **voted to approve** the recommendation to sell the parsonage at 4 Nathaniel Road, Barrington. However, our by-laws require **two consecutive votes** by the congregation before moving forward with any "significant financial transaction".

A **second congregational meeting** has therefore been called for the church membership to vote a second time on the recommendation. It will take place in

the sanctuary immediately after worship **this Sunday, May 12**. A quorum will again be needed so all church members are asked to make every effort to attend. **Childcare** will again be provided.

An email was sent out yesterday from BCCUCC's Governing Board with more detailed information for the congregation including the **motion** that was approved at the April 28 meeting and that will be voted on again at the May 12 meeting. There's also information on the factors that led to the Board's recommendation to sell the parsonage. If you haven't already, we encourage you to read it prior to Sunday's meeting.
