Juneteenth - a history

Juneteenth commemorates the reading of President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation and the freeing of 250,000 enslaved people in Texas on **June 19, 1865**. Although Lincoln had issued the Proclamation on January 1, 1863, there had not been enough Union troops in Texas to enforce the edict until Union General Gordon Granger arrived there with 2000 federal troops



after the confederate surrender in April,1865. Juneteenth thus marks the the final emancipation of those held as slaves in the confederacy. However, Lincoln's Proclamation did not apply to border states, and it was not until the adoption of the Thirteenth Amendment in December of 1865 that the institution of slavery was abolished throughout the country.

The first celebrations of Juneteenth occurred in 1866 in Texas, but the holiday soon spread throughout the south and finally to major cities across the country. Juneteenth is now recognized in 47 states, and there is a movement to have Congress establish it as a national holiday.

Celebrating Juneteenth in RI

The holiday was celebrated in Providence for the first time last year at the Temple to

Music in Roger Williams Park. This year's RI event will be virtual; it will be livestreamed on **Friday**, **June 19th** from the headquarters of **Black-owned radio station 89.9** and can be seen on the <u>Juneteenth RI Facebook page</u> between **7 and 9 pm**.

Please note the following changes for the summer

In addition to the **worship service beginning at 9:30 am** (see above), the following changes will take place during the summer months – many starting this weekend:



New to Zoom? Here's what you need to know

Zoom is pretty easy to set up and use. If you are using a tablet or smartphone (iPad or Android) there are apps to use. You should be able to find the app "Zoom" in your App Store. If you are using your computer (ideally with a camera, like most





email, it will take you to a website and ask to install Zoom on your computer. Say "yes".

It is a very small and pretty quick download and install.

Once installed, whenever you click on a zoom link it will automatically launch zoom and log you into the meeting. If it doesn't log you into the meeting automatically, you can manually type in the meeting ID into the Zoom app (on computer, smartphone, or tablet) and then the password, and it will take you to the meeting.

Our Faith, Our Vote, Our Voice

Use your voice to tell our state leaders to raise the RI Works benefit: The **Raising RI Coalition** is a group of community, healthcare, social service and advocacy organizations that serve low-income

families and are working to ensure that families can meet their basic needs. The Coalition seeks to raise the RI Works benefit to 50% of the federal poverty level over the next two years – to lift Rhode Island Works children and families out of deep poverty. The Rhode Island Works benefit has not been increased in close to 30 years, while all other New England states have adjusted their benefit to help families' purchasing power keep up with inflation. The 4,000 families currently enrolled in the program receive an average of \$6/person/day. The benefit is 30% of the federal poverty level, meaning that 10,000 Rhode Islanders, including 7,200 children, are living in deep poverty (50% of the poverty level).
