

Food donations needed for BACKPACK program in June

Once a month BCCUCC distributes 25 bags of food to students at the DelSesto Middle School in Providence for the Loaves and Fishes RI BACKPACK program. We continue to partner with We Share Hope (https://wesharehope.org) and Books are Wings (https://www.booksarewings.org), but to supplement these donations and fill the bags, we add regular items each month such as peanut butter, bread, oatmeal, canned tuna, canned chicken, pasta, pasta sauce, fruit cups, shelf stable pudding, thanks to the generosity of our congregation. To donated food items please use this SignUp Genius link to mark which items you plan to bring and also indicate the number of items you are signing up to donate. You can also call the church office if you need assistance with this. Food donations need to be dropped off at the church no later than Sun, June 19th so that the bags can be packed before our next

From the UCC - an online event for Juneteenth

The U.S. federal holiday, <u>Juneteenth National</u> <u>Independence Day</u>, is **Monday**, **June 20th**. It commemorates June 19, 1865, the day that Union Army Maj. Gen. Gordon Granger arrived in Galveston, Tex., and told enslaved people of their emancipation. That was more than two years after President Abraham Lincoln issued the <u>Emancipation Proclamation</u> on Jan. 1, 1863.



Remembering that day "acknowledges God's sacred people of African descent," said the Rev. Velda Love, UCC minister of <u>racial justice</u> and leader of <u>Join the Movement</u> <u>Toward Racial Justice</u>. Hearing real stories from those people, she said, is a way to counteract white supremacist "efforts to suppress the truth of our history."
