# **Historic Vote at Synod**

### Synod approves replacing 3 Southern NE Conferences with 1

Delegates to the United Church of Christ's national meeting on Monday, June 24th overwhelmingly approved a request by its three conferences in Connecticut, Massachusetts and Rhode Island to dissolve and join together to form a new conference. The vote was 601 to 90, with four delegates abstaining. The new conference, not yet named, will officially come into being on January 1st, 2020. <u>Read more</u>

### The McCoys will be welcoming a family from Mexico

Lory and Charlie McCoy are welcoming to their home a woman

and her 2 children (ages 10 and 12) from Mexico who are legally seeking asylum. This will be a huge change in the family's lives. The family will need a lot of assistance as they transition to RI. The McCoys are willing to provide for most of their needs, but are looking for any assistance in transportation, short term housing when the McCoys are away, being "on call" for the family's needs when Lory is at work, clothing, financial assistance, and help as they negotiate though the school system, the government offices, and the many human services agencies. **Update:** The McCoys are hoping that the mother and two younger daughters will arrive during the first two weeks of August. The girls will then be ages 11 and 13. Her third daughter (16 yrs old) also recently crossed into the United States and was sent to Florida, probably to the Homestead shelter that we've heard about on the news. We're hoping that she is safe and we can ultimately have her move to Rhode Island as well. They will need clothing (size 12 for the 11 yr old, size 12-13 for the 13 yr old, and size medium for the mom) and monetary donations for their many personal expenses (toiletries, cell phone fees, immigration fees, school supplies, computer for homework, possibly bicycles, etc.) Contact Lory (see above) with questions or offers of help.




#### **Bereavement Group**
