Update on the Sale of the Parsonage

We are pleased to share that the sale of the Parsonage has been successfully completed. After the congregation approved the sale, a member informed us that a family member was interested in purchasing the property. To ensure fairness, we engaged an independent professional to appraise the property, which was valued at \$525,000—exceeding the initially approved amount.



Given that this appraisal was acceptable to the buyer, we proceeded with the sale, which was finalized on August 1. Additionally, by selling the property directly, the church saved on realtor fees, further benefiting our financial position. The Endowment Team is now in the process of investing the funds.

Results of fundraising efforts to reunite Khaled with his family

On Saturday, July 13th, BCCUCC hosted Atwater-Donnelly for a concert and silent auction to benefit the family of Khaled, a refugee from Afghanistan who church member Gabrielle Sclafani met while volunteering with the Lutheran Church in Germany in 2019-2020. Khaled is now a permanent resident of Canada, through the sponsorship of the Unitarian Universalist Association of Halifax, and he called upon Gabrielle and BCCUCC this spring for financial assistance in getting his family out of Iran, where they have been living as undocumented immigrants, to Turkey where they will be received by the Canadian embassy and transported to Halifax, Nova Scotia to be reunited with Khaled after eleven years of separation.







The night was marked by a sense of togetherness and joy. Aubrey and Elwood Atwater-Donnelly donated their music, and many church and community members volunteered their time and joined the open mic accompanied by our own Matthew Marion. The terrace set the scene for a beautiful silent auction featuring donations from church members, the larger membership of the Hameho Garden Club, and many generous local businesses. The event raised \$3000 for Khaled's family, which contributes to a total of more than \$12,500 we raised to support them in their journey, and to make a modest contribution to immigrant families in our local RI community.

The latest word from Khaled is that his family will be underway within two weeks after some minor delays. With blessings for a safe journey and a smooth process at the embassy in Turkey, they will reach their new home in Canada in September. Khaled is deeply grateful for the support of this community and looks forward to visiting in person as soon as he is able. May we all think of his family this week as they say goodbye to the country they have called home for the last twenty-two years and begin their next chapter with safety and hope.



Grab-bag Summer Sermon Series continues

If you read <u>Dale's June 20th blog</u> you'll know that he and Racquel are doing a Grab-bag Summer Sermon Series. This means that when you come to church this summer, you are invited to fill out a yellow slip (included in each summer bulletin) with a suggested sermon topic, place it in a bag with all the others during Announcements time, and then Racquel or Dale will draw from the bag and preach on whatever theme they draw out. They do this new each week, so if you bring a suggestion one week and it doesn't get



chosen, you will need to bring it again in future weeks as there is no sense in them preaching on your topic on a week you aren't there!

Our ministers are open to being challenged to share a sermon on just about any topic, but there may be issues or topics they feel will be too volatile or divisive to preach off the cuff. In these cases, they may wish to hold onto that topic and address it another day when they've had more time to prepare themselves and you for the message.

On some Sundays this summer, the hymns are also chosen this way, so you can request your favorite hymn - and if it's one of the 3 hymns chosen from the grab-bag, it'll get sung that morning.
