#### **Problems with online worship**

Unfortunately we are currently unable to livestream our worship service for which we apologize. The big storm a couple of weeks ago resulted in us losing a number of electrical systems. We're pleased to report



that our fire alarms are back online but the internet in the church building is still out. It's taking a little longer to fix than we'd hoped, but it should be back working in time to livestream our Open Doors Sunday service on September 8. A video of the August 25 service can be viewed on Facebook and hopefully a video of the September 1 service will also be posted there.

# Summer is almost over... ...and our fall programs are about to begin

**Sunday, September 1** will be the last of our summer worship services with a grab bag sermon and the congregation chooses the hymns! The service is at 10 am and includes communion.



**The church office** will be closed on **Monday, September 2** for Labor Day. On **Tuesday, September 3** we return to regular office hours: Mon - Fri, 9:30 am - 1:30 pm.

#### **Nursery Care**

Nursery Care continues every Sunday for ages 0-3 years. Parents can drop their children off in the **Nursery**, located in the Education Building, on their way into church. There's also a **Nursery Nook** downstairs where a parent can retreat with their child of any age and still hear the service on the loudspeaker down there. We enjoy the sound of children in worship and provide these options for parents who prefer to worship without distraction.

#### Registration required for children and youth

Registration will take place after the 10 am worship service on **Sundays**, **September 8 & 15**. There will be a table in Fellowship Hall where parents/guardians can fill out the forms. Or save time and download a <u>2024-2025 registration form</u> to fill out ahead of time.



**Note:** If your child/children was registered for the 2023-2024 church school year, all you'll have to do is review last year's form, change the grade, make any necessary updates and initial it! For insurance purposes EACH child and youth from infants through grade 12 is required to have their own form filled out or updated EVERY YEAR in order to participate in church programs including Church School, Youth Group, and Confirmation. Thank you for your attention to this.

### **Changes coming to our Church School Structure**

This year we have made some adjustments to our Church School to accommodate our changing Church School population:

- PreK 2nd grade will be in the Godly Play room.
- 3rd 5th will enjoy the rotation program, Deep Blue.
- 6th 8th graders (Seekers) will study world religions.

The way Church School happens will remain the same except on some special Sundays. All of



Church School classes begin on Sunday, September 15.

Children from PreK through Grade 8 attend the first part of the worship service in the sanctuary with their families, then after the children's message they leave to go to their Church School classes in the Education building. Their teacher will accompany them. On Sundays when there is All Ages Worship, such as September 8, the children remain in the sanctuary for the whole of the family-friendly service.
